

Good Faith Estimate for Health Care Items and Services Client

Estimated Cost of Services for Master's Level practitioners:

Admission: \$175 60 minute session: \$150, Family session: \$150, 30 minute session: \$75, Court related costs are subject to \$175 per hour.

Estimated Cost of Services for PhD and PsyD practitioners:

Admission: \$200 60 minute session: \$175 Family session: \$175 30 minute session: \$100 Court related costs are subject to \$200 per hour.

ADHD assessments: \$725 (We do not accept private insurance for testing services)

Estimated Cost of Service for Medication Evaluation/Management Admission: \$250

Follow up: \$100-\$150 (depending on time and intensity)

Disclaimer: This Good Faith Estimate shows the costs of items and services that are reasonably expected for your health care needs for an item or service. The estimate is based on information known at the time the estimate was created. The Good Faith Estimate does not include any unknown or unexpected costs that may arise during treatment. You could be charged more if complications or special circumstances occur. If this happens, federal law allows you to dispute (appeal) the bill. If you are billed for more than this Good Faith Estimate, you have the right to dispute the bill. You may contact the health care provider or facility listed to let them know the 11. Good Faith Estimate 2023 billed charges are higher than the Good Faith Estimate. You can ask them to update the bill to match the Good Faith Estimate, ask to negotiate the bill, or ask if there is financial assistance available. You may also start a dispute resolution process with the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS). If you choose to use the dispute resolution process, you must start the dispute process within 120 calendar days (about 4 months) of the date on the original bill. There is a \$25 fee to use the dispute process. If the agency reviewing your dispute agrees with you, you will have to pay the price on this Good Faith Estimate. If the agency disagrees with you and agrees with the health care provider or facility, you will have to pay the higher amount.
